The Cape of Good Hope SPCA Inspectorate Department has a position available for a qualified Inspector. This position is situated within Cape Town. Applications are invited from those who consider that they have the required skills and training to fill this position. The successful candidate will be responsible for conducting inspections, enforcing animal protection legislation, collecting of animals, rescues, and other duties as and when required to assist within the department. Hours required to work will be every weekend and two-week days according to a roster.

Reporting to the Chief Inspector the Inspector should check all the requirements:

- A valid South African driver's license minimum Code EB (08);
- Grade 12 level of education (Std 10);
- NSPCA Inspectors qualification
- Be enthusiastic about Animal Welfare and have a passion for animals;
- Experience working with animals;
- Willingness to work with, handle, and care for all animals; - Clean police/credit records;
- Be approachable;
- Have good communication skills;
- Have the ability to communicate and write in English/Afrikaans and/or Xhosa (a Xhosa-speaking candidate will receive preference);
- Have basic computer and good administration skills;
- Be able to use initiative and be organised;
- Be of sober habits and be presentable;
- Maintain a high standard of ethics and discretion regarding sensitive information; - Have the ability to follow instructions;
- Possess good time management, communication and interpersonal skills; - Have the ability to work independently as well as within a team;
